

Description:

Hearing differences can impact teenagers in many ways above and beyond audition and speech/language challenges, including acceptance and understanding of what it means to be "deaf." This presentation will review the research on cultural identity development, and more specifically, deaf identity development in teenagers. Based on psychological research, specific strategies for how to support identity formation in teenage students will be discussed, including considerations for intersectionality of multiple identities. Case examples will also be reviewed.





TRAUMA AND AMYGDALA HIJACKS


This training is broken into two parts.


During the first part of this training, participants will learn about:

- How trauma re-wires the brain and how and why
- students of all ages can experience amygdala hijacks.
- How an amygdala hijack occurs when the amygdala overrides a person's ability to respond rationally to a perceived threat.
- Why we often see students extremely escalated and exhibiting violent behavior during these events.
- Why this type of behavior is especially common in kids who have experienced trauma.

During the second part of the training we will discuss:

- How educators can safely and effectively manage "hijacked" students and get to the root cause of the behavior.
- Why punitive measures don't work
- What we can do instead.
- How trauma explains the behavior, but it does not excuse it.



A 4-part Series to Transform Literacy Practice

January 22, 2025: The Reading Tiered Fidelity Inventory (R-TFI): What is it and How Can I Use it to Improve Literacy Instruction? The Reading Tiered Fidelity Inventory (RTFI) is a research-based tool designed to help schools evaluate the implementation and effectiveness of their multi- tiered systems of support (MTSS) for literacy. Learn how this tool can be used to help classrooms improve in the key domains needed for reading success.

January 29, 2025: STAR: Sit Together And Read

The Sit Together And Read (STAR) program is an evidence-based approach that promotes early literacy through shared reading experiences between adults and young children. By focusing on the power of interactive reading and rich language exposure, STAR fosters foundational skills essential for long- term reading success.

February 5, 2025: To Supplement or Not to Supplement, That is the Question

This session will guide educators in identifying when and how to effectively supplement their core literacy curriculum to meet the diverse needs of their students. Participants will explore criteria for selecting high-quality, evidence- based resources that align with structured literacy practices and enhance instructional outcomes.




